Things you should know about the University of Graz:

- The University has 6 faculties, 76 departments and offers 100 different fields of study
- In total 3.933 people work at Graz University of which 2.700 people are academic staff
- 31.500 students (4.600 beginners, 3.011 graduates) are studying at Graz University, 12% of those are international students
- Graz University is a comprehensive university with a strong international profile, it is Austria's 2nd oldest university and one of the largest in the country
- It has a study-friendly campus, state-of-the-art infrastructure & efficient administration
- For incoming students and staff there is a strong administrative & academic support on all levels
- One main focus is offering innovative interdisciplinary research & research-based teaching
- The University of Graz has an active scientific, economic and cultural exchange with partners worldwide

Things you should know about Graz and Styria:

- Graz is a charming student town in the heart of Europe
- It is the second largest city in Austria with about 300.000 inhabitants (of which 60.000 are students) and it is the capital of Styria
- Graz has been awarded the title of UNESCO's World Heritage
- In 2003 Graz was the Cultural Capital of Europe and in 2011 it was awarded the title of UNESCO's City of Design
- The Hollywood star and former governor of California Arnold Schwarzenegger grew up in a small village close to Graz.
- Dietrich Mateschitz, the founder of the Red Bull energy drink company and owner of the formula 1 team Red Bull Racing was born in Styria.
- Graz has 127,58 square kilometers area (40 percent are green spaces)
- The river Mur divides the city into two parts which are connected through 15 bridges

Things you should do in Graz:

- Visit one of the oldest department stores of the city, Kastner & Öhler, and drink a coffee on the rooftop bar
- Go to one of the popular farmers' markets to buy a bottle of original Styrian pumpkin seed oil
- Buy some ice cream in Sporgasse and take a walk through the old town and its beautiful winding streets
- Walk up the 260 steps of Schlossberg to the Clock Tower to have a marvelous view over the whole city
- Visit the beautiful baroque styled Eggenberg Palace and its precious park full of peacocks
- Take a walk through the biggest armoury of the world - the Grazer Zeughaus
- Relax and enjoy the view of Graz from the Murinsel, the manmade island in the river Mur
- Visit an exhibition in our "friendly alien", the Kunsthaus of Graz, which owns its nickname to its very special biomorphic shape
- Go surfing on the river Mur in summer
- Watch a breathtaking production in the Opera House of Graz or one of the many theaters
